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Dear IPS Community,

Enrolment surge (excerpt from my principal report to school council)

We had initially hoped to only increase the number of classes by one in 2018 however the nature of the enrolments has resulted in inequitable and unwieldy class sizes regardless of how we have modelled twenty-six classes.

In the final week of Term Three the volume of enrolment enquiries had exponentially increased, partly due to the imminent closure of a neighbouring school and closely related to the increase in the number of family sized apartments and housing developments coming on the market close to the school.

While we have held the line that unless a student is "currently living in the residence within the IPS "zone" it is not possible to enrol at IPS", it is important to understand that more than likely early in 2018 these new homes will be occupied by those who are making enrolment enquiries now.


Therefore it is of the utmost importance that we strategically structure our classes to future proof the school's capacity rather than simply managing the current enrolment. Our anticipated 2018 enrolment will be more than 620, so it can be assumed the pressure on enrolments will continue for some time to come.

The number of available classrooms (including the Collaboration space / MPR) had already been accounted for in the previously anticipated twenty-six classroom model but it is evident this will not meet the newly anticipated requirements of the school. In short, IPS will likely offer twenty-eight classes in 2018.

Over the holiday period, considerable work was done to procure an additional building to cater for this emerging need. Please note: In the 2016 to 2018 period there have not and will not be any double story portables available and the Capital Works Grant would not have been nearly enough to enable a double story building to be erected.

The immediate impact of a new building will be two-fold. On the negative side there will be a temporary reduction in play space, in this case on the edge of the oval. On the positive side there will be reduced class sizes particularly in the junior years. The leadership team will explore timetabling to reduce the effect of the reduction in physical space. Large multi-age classes in small rooms are what we are trying to avoid in order for every student to achieve their very best.

Given we have been through the process recently that resulted in one Mod 5 being placed at the top of the oval area we already know that we are limited in where a second Mod 5 will go. In conversations with the DET planning the best scenario is adjacent to the other Mod 5 maintaining the village atmosphere with the current Year 1 Year 2 classes.



The long-term asset plan has the relocatables being removed from the oval, play space reclaimed and a two story permanent building(s) replacing the portables at the bottom of the Lowe street entrance to the school.

Knowing the number of classrooms available is fundamental to planning the makeup of classes and developing the 2018 workforce plan.

SCHOOL COUNCIL REPORT 25TH OCTOBER

Class enrolment and class room structures. The increase in the enrolment numbers and pressure on class structures. The successful application for 2 additional relocatable classrooms and future planning.

The Capital Build Project and the temporary decanting of the RL5 and RL6 on to the basketball court, elevating the structure so it does not disturb the garden space and concrete.

Staffing Sue Jones (Assistant Principal) will be taking leave for the 2018 school year. Pam Wright from Thomastown West has been appointed to the position. Pam has acted in this role previously and is known to the community.

Tanya Roberts will remain on Family leave in 2018. Haylee Lyttle will remain on staff replacing Tanya

Allison Stott will remain on Family Leave and will return part-time in Term 2 2018.. Zoe Minnis will continue to cover Allison Stott's leave until Term 2.

Annette Stott will retire at the end of the 2017.

Steven Villani and Sara Villani will begin leave from Term Two for the remainder of the 2018 school year. The appointment of their replacements will occur in Term 1 2018

A 12 month teacher contract, leading teacher position and the appointment of 2 additional teachers will be advertised for 2018.

Class teachers have not been allocated for 2018.

'Colour Kaleidoscope' Art Show.

The grade three and four art show 'Colour Kaleidoscope' will be held on the 31st October and the 1st November in the Collaborative Space (MPR).

The student's art works were created after visiting Hatch Contemporary Art Space where they viewed the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders exhibition 'Nhalinggu Bagung'. They also gained inspiration by viewing and discussing the art work of Sally Gabori, Kudditji Kngwarreye, Jeanne Petyarre and Tiger Yaltangki. The student's artistic response to this work was not to replicate the indigenous art work but to find symbols and images that are represented in their own lives. They drew a design using pattern, shape, colour and form. They experimented with watercolour paint application and mixed colours by observing the colour wheel.

We are very fortunate to have Terry Makin the President of Reconciliation Banyule to open the exhibition. The opening will commence at 3pm on the 31st October with the show open until 5pm that day. On the 1st November the art show will be open from 9am to 3.30pm.

I hope you can come and celebrate the grade 3 and 4 student's individual and collective talents.

- Miscellaneous things;


Old dolls; that you don't mind us painting or pulling to bits!
