Last week 72 Grade 6 students and 7 staff had a fantastic educational tour of the national capital. Students enthusiastically participated in a variety of programmes with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. Lessons such as "Debating a Bill" in the PEO and a tour of Parliament House, Old Parliament House – "Who is the Boss", National Electoral Education Centre – House of Representatives program, Australian War Memorial – laying a wreath, National Museum, National Gallery – guided tour, High Court of Australia, Mint, AIS, Questacon and ice skating.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit their National Capital as part of their civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the tour the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) programme toward those costs. This rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the tour.
