All Bracelets and Voucher Books purchased online will be sent home with your families oldest Ivanhoe Primary School child on Thursday November 16th and Friday 17th, before for the Twilight Fair or they can be collected from the rides booth on Fair Day. Cyber Safety

The last two years has seen a big push at our school for digital learning technologies. Work in the classrooms has focused on cyber safety, netiquette and appropriate online behaviours. The Years five and sixes will shortly have a visit from Leading Senior Constable Tracey PORTER our local Victoria Police Youth Resource Officer who has 27 years of policing experience - 23 years working in child abuse. She has expertise in cyber safety such as sexting/bullying/apps/social media. She will speak with students on the 23rd November to educate them on how to stay safe online and the legalities of bullying and other antisocial behaviours.

She will also provide an opportunity to speak with interested parents at an early evening forum on the same day at 5.30pm and advise on what apps the kids are using, what apps are potentially dangerous as well as provide invaluable tips to be able to support children online.

There is no charge for this. The Year 5 and 6 student sessions augment the curriculum program and the parent and community session is to provide parents with an opportunity to glean some valuable advice and insight into a topic that is unfortunately part of the world our children are growing up in.

Tracey has presented to many schools both primary and secondary as well as community groups. The feedback from other schools has been very positive.

Here's a great Recipe to Bake for the Fair Cake Stall

Donna Hay's Orange Poppy Seed Cake

Cake

1/3 cup poppyseeds

¾ cup milk

2 cups self-raising flour

200g softened, diced butter

finely grated zest from one large orange

half a cup of caster sugar

3 free-range eggs

½ cup freshly squeezed orange juice

syrup

½ cup caster sugar

¾ cup freshly squeezed orange juice

shredded zest from one large orange

Preheat oven to 160C and grease and line a 20cm round cake tin.

Mix milk and poppyseeds in a small bowl; set aside.

Place butter, sugar and rind in bowl of electric mixer and mix until combined.

Scrape down sides of bowl, then beat in eggs one at a time.

Add flour, orange juice, and milk poppyseed mixture and stir until just combined.

Scrape into the pan and bake for around 40-50 minutes

Meanwhile, make syrup: place all ingredients into small saucepan and stir over low heat until sugar dissolves.

Increase heat and boil for five minutes or until thick. Stain syrup and reserve shredded zest

When the cake is cooked, leave it in the tin and pour the syrup over. Leave the cake to cool and then turn onto serving Platter, decorate with the reserve shredded zest (optional)

Serve warm or cold with thick cream if you like
