Dear school community.

The year is racing by so quickly yet there is still so much to be accomplished and so much to be a part of.

Next week our second school review meeting is scheduled for the 30th November and the Panel will be speaking to a forum of teachers and a forum of students about a variety of topics that look to unpack among other things to what extent do students contribute to school improvement and to what extent do all teams have a shared responsibility for improved student achievement? These conversations along with a variety of other feedback gathered over the course of the year will be a key driver in the development of our next Strategic Plan. Once the review is completed a report will be published to the community.

On Friday 2nd December it's Innovation Day from 9am to 11am and we are inviting families, friends and other members of the school community to come along and see how the students have used innovation in their own learning.

The Makers' Space is located in the Innovation Centre (previously the Multipurpose Room), and is an event that will start and end the day's Innovation Trail. This is a space where students from Grades 5 and 6 will be demonstrating some basic robotics and coding. You will have the opportunity to play games with the students and test out your own Digi Tech skills. You also get to see how games come to life as students will show you how they are made.



TRAFFIC MESSAGE

Parents are urged to adhere to the following when using the side streets surrounding Ivanhoe Primary:
