Welcome back to school.

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The weather has been kind to us and although still a little cool it is important to realise that its the time of year where the UV index climbs. Hats must be worn outside during recess and lunchtime as well as during PE.

NO HAT / NO PLAY is to safeguard students from the sun's harmful rays and those without a hat will be directed to shady areas of the playground.

As I explained to students at Monday's assembly, the ramp and veranda of "the treehouse" (next year's Foundation building) can be used for quiet activities, but not chasey or other games likely to cause injury.

I was pleasantly surprised when I checked this week to find the students had taken this on board. It's a small thing but it does demonstrate a respect for our community and our facilities.



Allowing the students to use the building in this way and removing the fences has freed up play space and alleviated some of the pressure from the oval and soccer pitch.

Preliminary planning has commenced for further major building works that will ultimately result in the reclamation of play spaces currently housing relocatable classrooms. The \$4.500,000 will go a long way towards building new classrooms, redeveloping play space and removing portables. I am hopeful that most of the 2019 school year will be free of construction.

Earlier in the year we were visited by the Shadow Minister for Education who has agreed to the provision of \$50,000 toward the redevelopment of the students toilet block at the top of the school. Depending on election results, but regardless we will need to continue to address concerns with these facilities as our population continues to grow.

I would like to thank the entire community, students' families and staff for the patience, understanding and trust that has enabled the current round of capital works to be completed. There will be a formal opening at some point of the new building in due course. However, to leave it standing idle while we wait for the powers that be to find time in their calendars, would be to waste a valuable opportunity to road test its capacities for teaching and learning.

Students will be using this amazing space shortly and part of our Innovation Week in November will be held here. The Foundation teachers have held many discussions regarding furniture and fit out for storage. Orders will be placed early next week.

Although this Sunday's working bee targets Year 2 families, there is always more planned to be accomplished than is actually achieved. Students are welcome and can earn house points for attending.
