Walk charter a step in the right direction

PUT your car keys away, pop on some sneakers and pound the pavement as Banyule is part of the International Charter for Walking.

Banyule has joined neighbouring municipalities including Darebin, Manningham and Monash councils in promoting walking by signing the worldwide deed on Thursday.

Mayor Craig Langdon said the charter – Walk21 – aimed to make walking an enjoyable part of daily transport, recreation and health. Cr Langdon said the council is providing a network of shared walking trails and footpaths, as well as supporting events including Walk to School month.

"Each year, council promotes and supports the Vic-Health Walk to School month with 12 Banyule primary schools involved last year," Cr Langdon said.

"Ivanhoe Primary School and its students have always been very enthusiastic supporters of Walk to School, signing up again for this year's event."


Vietnam visit


modern facility that is currently being re-imagined by Maddison architects. School Council looks forward to sharing the designs with the community when there is something definitive to show. Stay tuned...


In this Olympic Year this was too good not to share

Thankyou to all parents who have registered for the online ordering of canteen lunches.

The benefits of having the online ordering system will greatly improve the efficiency of running the canteen.

Canteen Online came about in response to Canteen Committee requirements and Parents requests. The Canteen Committee trialled Canteen Online in 2014 with a group of canteen users.

A research survey was sent out to parents late last year.

Canteen Online was approved by The Finance Committee and School Council.

The Online ordering system has been commissioned because of the following;

- The lack of volunteers assisting the canteen manager.
- Increased student population has increased the number of orders.
- The technology makes the canteen manager's job more efficient.
- The system is in line with the technology other school canteens are utilising.
- Easy correlation of orders and preparation of food
- * More time to prepare food
- * Greater Allergy alerts
- * Parent advanced ordering.
- * Over all better Canteen service.
