


MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

Whilst we recognise the increased use of mobile phones in our community and the circumstances parents may provide mobile phones to their students for reasons for security, the disruptive influence and potential misuse of mobile phones and similar technologies needs to be minimised. There are no reasons why a student needs to have or use a mobile phone during the school day. In case of an emergency, the school office remains the vital and appropriate point of contact.



To this end, we discourage students bringing mobile phones to school. The school accepts no responsibility for lost, stolen or damaged mobile phones or similar devices. Students are advised that if they bring a mobile phone to school it must be switched off before entering the school grounds and remain switched off for the duration of the day. Students are to keep the switched off phone in their bags at all times. Students are not permitted to take mobile phones on excursions or camps (even for the primary use as a camera), or other school functions.


