GRADE 6 CANBERRA TOUR 17 – 21 OCTOBER

On Monday 17 October at 7.30 am 78 Grade 6 students and 8 staff will depart for a fantastic educational tour of the national capital. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programmes with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. Activities such as a lesson at Parliament House Tour & PEO, Australian Electoral Commission – education program, National Museum education program "Meet the People", National Gallery - guided tour, High Court of Australia, Mint, Australian War Memorial, AIS, Questacon and ice skating.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit their National Capital as part of their civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the tour the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) programme toward those costs. This rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the tour.

SUN AND UV PROTECTION

Parents are reminded that the school's **SUNSMART** Policy is in operation from 3 October (first day of Term 4). From October until April, or when the Ultra Violet (UV) level reaches 3, it is important to use a combination of sun



protection measures to minimise the risk of skin and eye damage, and skin cancer.

Students need to wear a wide brimmed hat at school each day this term. Your assistance in ensuring your child has the correct type of hat will be appreciated.

YARD SUPERVISION

Supervision of students before and after school is provided at the following times: 8.45 am to 9.00 am and 3.30 pm to 3.45 pm.

Outside these times supervision and / or collection of students is the responsibility of parents / guardians. For the safety of students parent support for these times is sought.

Parents who need to drop their child at school before 8.45 am should consider using the Before School Care program.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

All visitors, including parents, must report to the school office to sign in.

Parents, please do not go directly to your child's classroom.

Parents are also required to visit the school office, to collect an early leave pass, prior to taking their children out early.

SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN BEFORE SCHOOL

Increasingly, more children are being dropped off at school well before 8.45am—in some cases at 8am.

If your child is not booked into the Before School Care program you must not leave your child unattended in the school grounds. Parents are responsible for making suitable arrangements for their children prior to the yard duty teachers arriving at 8.45am.
