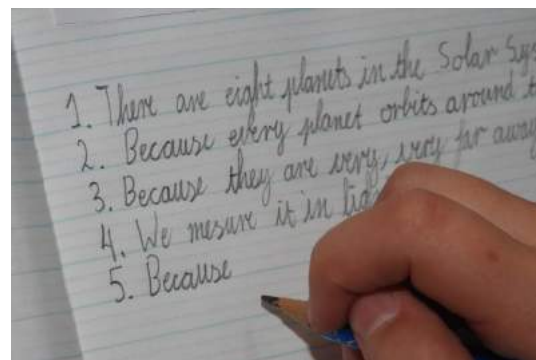

Dear School Community

As our principal Mark Kent is recovering from orthopaedic foot surgery I thought it important to reiterate from School Council, the School's Plans to cater for future enrolment numbers.

Enrolments trends

By using enrolment trend data and working with The Department of Education and Training (DE&T), our principal Mark Kent and School Council have increased our capacity for enrolment.

Enrolment as of today's date is 601 students.

The School enrolment demand will increase with future developments in Ivanhoe.

Therefore our enrolment capacity in 2017 will need to increase to meet local enrolment catchment pressures.

New Modular 5 Relocatable Class Room

To cater for demand DE&T have allocated to the school a relocatable (mod 5) classroom.

What does it look like?

The building is a brand new single storey structure encompassing two class rooms with a small shared learning space. The exterior paint work is of natural coloration to blend with the environment.

The dimensions are 18 metres by 10 metres. Each perimeter wall must be 3 metres from existing structures.



Where will it go?

The size and requirements of the relocatable have made it extremely difficult to position within the school grounds as there is minimal space for such a large structure.

We understand play space is at a premium but there are limited options.

The new classroom will be positioned on the edge of the school oval facing the small set of stairs leading down from the indigenous garden.

The entrance will face the existing grade 1 and 2 relocatable classrooms.

The area will become a Grade 1 and Grade 2 learning space.

Every effort will be made to maintain all the existing indigenous trees on the edge of the oval.



Toilets

The small relocatable toilet in front of the grade 1 and 2 class rooms is due to be removed by the department. The external hall toilet doors (behind the canteen) will be opened for use at all times. These are very clean and up to date.

School Council will discuss the refurbishment of the existing toilets attached to the main building, at the next School Council Meeting.

\$2 Million Dollar Capital Works

Currently Maddison architects are developing plans that will replace the old Grade 3 relocatables with permanent progressive, modern class rooms.

Council looks forward to sharing the designs with the community. An information night will be held to educate the School Community of the design when it is approved by school council.

Creation of new play spaces

In order to maximise the utilisation of available spaces within the school grounds, the school council and members of the school community have recently applied for an Inclusive Schools Grant to redevelop the space in front of the Grade 1 and 2 classrooms. The Inclusive Schools Fund is a \$20 million fund designed to help make Victoria the Education State, providing Victorian Government schools with quality new spaces and more inclusive facilities, based on best practice research.

With the pending removal of the toilet block from this area we are seeking funding to convert this area and adjoining spaces into an Outdoor Sensory Learning Space. The proposed area for re-development runs from the existing shelter structure to the sandpit at the boundary line. The proposed area will consist of 3 'zones', including a quiet re-engagement space, an Outdoor Classroom which will be available to students during recess and lunch times, and a sensory play area which will provide students with tactile and interactive activities to engage with.

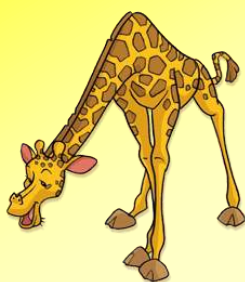
