Arrival and leaving school

Teachers are on duty from 8.45am in the morning. Children who arrive early may be directed to Out of School Hours Care and a fee may be charged.

Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund - CSEF

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

Ivanhoe Primary has zero tolerance for child abuse.



UNEXPLAINED ABSENCES ON COMPASS

Parents are responsible for keeping up-to-date their children's absences on Compass. When you logon onto your parent welcome page a short message will appear above the newsfeed on the top right hand side of the screen. 
will then see a list of times that your child was absent from school. By clicking on the box of the dates needing your approval you will be able to approve your child's absences.

Losing Weight is a Science. Keeping it off is a Psychology
