Attitudes to School Survey 2017

WE WANT OUR STUDENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. Last year we used the survey results in our development of the school's Annual Implementation Plan.

This will be the first year that Year 4 students have been included.

Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey.

This year the Attitudes to School Survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 22 May to Friday 23 June. The survey only takes 20-30 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time. The survey results will be reported back to the school in Term 3. No student can be identified in the results reported to schools or in any other report of the data.

SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN AFTER SCHOOL

Increasingly, more children are not being collected from school until 4pm or later. These students are brought up to the office foyer to wait for an adult to collect them. Sausage (beef, chicken or vegetarian), lettuce, tomato and cheese on wholemeal bread.

Recipe to make at home

I love making this simple Carrot Cake, it can be just for everyday or dress it up with a cream cheese frosting and it can make a lovely celebration cake too.

1 cup Self Raising Flour, 1 Cup Sugar (White or brown), 3teaspoons mixed spice, 2 cups of grated carrot (firmly packed), 2 eggs, ½ cup vegetable oil, ½ cup walnuts and ½ cup sultanas, or 1cup sultanas for nut free version. Mix all ingredients together until all are combined. It will be a fairly dry mixture, but the moisture comes from the carrots. Place in well-greased tin of choice. Sometimes I use cupcake tins, sometimes a loaf tin or small round tin. The mixture should fill about ¾ of the tin. Baked at 170C -180C deg till done. Check doneness by inserting a skewer, if it comes out clean it's done or if you lightly touch the top of cake and it springs back it's done. Enjoy.

G.A.T.E.WAYS Programs - Term 2 2017

G.A.T.E. WAYS is an independent organization which runs a range of workshops periodically throughout the year for interested gifted and talented students from Grade 1 to Grade 6.

The workshops are held at various locations, and cover a range of disciplines and interests.

Any parent wishing to enrol their child in one of these workshops needs to **check first** with their child's class teacher to ensure that the child's absence while attending Gateways sessions does not clash with other important school events such as excursions, camps, Naplan assessment etc and that the student is deemed a high achiever with a passion for the workshop content.

NB. *Transport to and from the workshops is the responsibility of parents.

***Sessions run from 9.30 am to 12.00 pm with 4 sessions spread over 4 weeks.**

***Fees for the workshops are \$ 225.00 per child.**

This term there are **Journeys programs** running at **Fitzroy Primary School** as follows.

These involve 4 consecutive sessions on Tuesday May 30, June 6, 13, and 20

***Grades 1 and 2- "Who's Got Mail?" (*creative writing using letter writing / story writing with mail*)**

***Grades 3 and 4- "Fantastic Mr Fox and the Law" (*drama, acting and public speaking*)**

***Grades 5 and 6- " Say it with Sizzle " (*public speaking workshops*)**

There are also Gateways **Eureka Programs** available this term which involve single day workshops for 'Maths on the Move'.

These are running at a **cost of \$99 for students in Years 1, 2 and 3** and **Years 4, 5 and 6** at Ivanhoe Girls Grammar School, Ivanhoe on 21 June for Lower Years and 22 June for Upper Years.

Full details of all workshops are included on flyers outside the office noticeboard.
