Dear Ivanhoe Primary School Community,

When I watch Liz Bonetti and Ms Morrow and Ms Murray conduct the students and listen to the music they make I can't help but be amazed, and proud of what our children and teachers collectively are able to achieve.

Did you know:

- You are four times more likely to be diagnosed with MS if you are born in Tasmania compared to the national average and 7 times more likely than if you were born in North Queensland.
- MS is the most common neurological condition diagnosed in young adults
- It is most commonly diagnosed between the ages of 20 and 40, and 75% of people diagnosed are women
- There is no known cause or cure.

A child's perspective on Gender shared by a parent

"Today over breakfast, my child and I had a conversation around gender - biases, stereotypes, etc- over breakfast. One of the questions she asked was why there are schools only for girls or boys in so many places? We processed that".

Did you know:

80% of Ivanhoe Primary School's waste is recyclable
Australia is ranked 5th highest for generating the most

Australian households and businesses produce a combined total of 3.3.million tonnes of food waste a year! That's enough to fill the MCG 6 times over!

municipal (residential) waste in the world

Our school is about to start recycling more by introducing commingled recycling bins (like the Yellow council bin you have at home) and soft plastics bins into the classrooms. This will help our school reduce what is sent to landfill.

To help stop sending food waste to landfill, which produces methane gas which is 30 times worse than Carbon Dioxide as a greenhouse gas, come learn how to compost at the Bellfield Community Garden.

LEARN HOW TO CREATE GOOD COMPOST and reduce your household waste to landfill

Free Compost Workshop this Saturday 27th May 2pm.

Where: Bellfield Community Garden - Corner Oriel Road and Banksia Street, Bellfield.

This will be conducted by Brian Koop of the St Johns Community Garden. If participants could bring any of the following: a mix of organic materials such as grass clippings, leaves, shredded paper or cardboard, vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, hay, sawdust, etc. The trick to generating a hot compost is quantity.

Recipe to make at home - Apple Cinnamon Crumble Muffins

Crumble Mix - 30g each - Butter/marg, rolled oats, sugar, coconut and self-raising flour. Mix thoroughly in food processor.

Muffin Mix - Bowl 1 - 2 cups self raising flour, ¾ cup sugar, 2 tsp cinnamon

Bowl 2 - 1 cup milk, 1/3 cup oil, 1 egg, 1 tsp vanilla, 1 cup chopped stewed apples (tinned)

Mix dry ingredients together. Mix wet ingredients together. Add wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and fold together until JUST combined. Spoon mixture into muffin tins, filling to the top of each one. Top each muffin with a large spoonful on the crumble mix. Bake at 180°C for 12-18 mins (depending on your oven).
