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From the Principal

Dear Ivanhoe Primary School Community,

Good learning requires passion, interest, and a curriculum that is built and delivered with relevance and purpose. This vision for teaching and learning is common sense. Effective schools focus on developing students as learners. Providing students with the capacity to take control of their learning is what great teachers and great schools do. At Ivanhoe Primary School we are developing a culture that embraces professional learning and clearly articulated beliefs about teaching and Learning that are lived in every classroom and specialist space. Curiosity and Powerful Learning is our approach and our journey focusses on developing consistent teaching and learning protocols, building authentic relationships and clearly articulating learning intentions. We encourage community wide participation in the effective and equitable education of every child.

Being interested and involved in your children's education is vital to engagement and learning

You know how important it is to your child's engagement and attitude towards school for you to show interest and participate in school-related activities. You make a point of attending as many school events as possible. You ask your child about specific learning at school. You take time to learn the names of their teachers. You ask to see examples of their schoolwork and find out what their favourite subjects are and why. There are literally hundreds of published research articles that show, without a shadow of a doubt, that parent interest and involvement in their children's education is at the top of the list of ways which you can encourage high levels of achievement in your child.

Child and Parent Factors That Impact Child Anxiety

There is also a considerable body of research has identified various child and parent factors that contribute to and maintain anxiety symptoms in children.

Regardless of the study you choose to follow nothing beats a loving supportive relationship that encourages your child to thrive.

Other things to consider:

- Chill out more often. Make time for yourself and time for your kids. Take a long walk together, visit a bookshop or library where kids can relax without having to talk).
- As a family, practice relaxation techniques (deep breathing, progressive muscle relaxation, exercise, visualisation, laughing, stretching, dancing, listening to music, singing, reading together, meditating together).
- Reassess your parenting style. Are you a helicopter parent or in danger of becoming one?
- Keep screen time to a minimum, especially if your child is excitable or easily agitated.
- Encourage age-appropriate independence and not just for your kids. You need time out to be as independent of them as they are of you.
- Talk often about fears and how they can, in many cases, be unfounded.
- Make sure your kids know how and where to contact you in an emergency not every five minutes.
- Ensure everyone has a good night's sleep and that healthy family nutrition is a top priority.
- Parent from the heart, rather than parenting from online advice and the myriad of books on how to be a 'super' parent.
