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From the Principal

Dear Ivanhoe Primary School Community,

Curiosity and Powerful Learning and our Strategic Plan

In the modern world, being a self-directed and self-determined learner is the most important skill to develop. School communities without clearly articulated beliefs around learning create wild inconsistencies for students as they travel between classrooms and take part in extracurricular experiences. Without a collaboratively created belief system that is lived each day through classroom norms for learning and a common language, schools cannot develop each child to his or her potential as a learner. (Change.School)

I spent Monday and Tuesday with 700 school leaders unpacking the why, what, who and how of change. Keynote speakers from the UK, USA and Canada spoke convincingly of the need for teacher collaboration, precision of purpose in learning in every classroom and the power of community made up of students, parents, teachers and others to positively influence the school experience of every child.

It was reassuring to note that we as a school are on the right track. Our four year goals in our strategic plan are:

- All students to be literate, numerate and curious learners.
- Build a consistent instructional practice in Literacy and Numeracy of every teacher.
- All students to be engaged, connected and make positive contributions to the development of the whole school community.
- Empower students through approaches that provide them with a greater voice in decisions that affect their school experience.
- All students to be resilient and display behaviors and attitudes that reflect the school values.
- Ensuring students have the tools, skills and modelling to enable them to develop positive and selfregulating behaviours

Our shared vision is that Ivanhoe Primary School encourages the development of the whole student. Our aim is to support learners in becoming curious, reflective and critical in their thinking as global citizens. Change does not happen quickly and sometimes, there are setback but if we work together with shared purpose we will make a difference for every child. We thank you for your support.
