Innovation Morning Wrap Up

We believe in learning for life.



Our job is to inspire learners of all ages to develop critical and creative thinking and problem solving skills to adapt to an increasingly global and competitive world.

Students need the ability to think critically and to find creative solutions to complicated problems because being able to do this is vitally important to live a full life and for future employment.


Research tells us that being able to think critically and creatively in an authentic context is a key to engagement and learning. And the aim of our school is to meet the learning needs of every student. We have high expectations of ourselves as well as our students.

The idea of developing more personalized learning experiences is so young people can pursue their individual talents and develop their strengths. Students need to engage in learning experiences grounded in a need to work problems and find solutions. This requires educators to cultivate new processes, strategies and protocols for teaching and learning.

One of the most common pieces of rhetoric you hear in the media when talking about education at secondary school is that we are trying to prepare students for jobs that will have disappeared by the time they graduate.

Broadly speaking when you prepare people to take a job you first prescribe what they should know and to be able to do. Therefore, the curriculum becomes - you shall know this - so you can perform that task!





Ideally, we need to move from a paradigm preparing employees for existing jobs to another paradigm that develops learning entrepreneurs who can create jobs for themselves and for others. That is education that creates and adds value.

Moving thinking to a more entrepreneurial model that values curiosity and powerful learning requires building students' capabilities as well as adopting a strength based approach to curriculum development.

Education should allow students to express and develop their own strengths.

In this way the curriculum becomes more personalised and allows students to have more voice in what they do and, to a greater extent, drive what they learn. In other words allowing students to have a lot more agency and ownership over their journey.

We want our students to create and add value to their education by identifying problems worth solving and then collaborating to explore creative solutions.

Over the course of our Innovation Morning I saw Foundation students creating algorithms in the form of treasure maps; students coding music;

Year 6 students physically building a computer;

Phys Ed students using video to analyse movement;

Unplugged activities around actions and consequences;

An Italian game show;

Digital language and mathematics activities and much more.

We are inviting students to be the innovators and they are stepping up.


