Dear Ivanhoe Primary School Community,

IPS to receive 4.5 million dollars in funding.

I am pleased to confirm that Ivanhoe Primary School will receive \$4.5 million in the 2018/19 State Budget to upgrade and modernise facilities.

Specifically, funds will progress the delivery of the school's masterplan replacing relocatable buildings with fit-for-purpose new permanent buildings addressing under-entitlement in permanent spaces.

This funding is in addition to the \$2 million provided in the 2016/17 State Budget to build the treehouse which is well underway.

Contact and absences.

From the end of Term 2, all Victorian government schools must contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence.

This requirement supports student safety and wellbeing. Schools need to know when and why a child is absent, and parents/carers need to know if their child is not at school.

Prompt communication also promotes daily school attendance.

Parents and carers must notify the school of their child's absence as soon as possible on the day of the absence using the school's preferred method, including online (in our case Compass) or by telephone.

To this end we are introducing the following service.

Trialling Compass Attendance Alerts by SMS from Tuesday 8th May 2018.

We are introducing and trialling a new system utilizing SMS to manage student attendance. Compass has the capacity to provide attendance alerts when students are unaccounted for. This means that if a child is absent from school and a parent has not already entered a reason for the absence into Compass, you will receive an SMS alert to your mobile phone (this requires parents to ensure the school has up to date contact details).

Errors may occur in the early phase of implementation. An example of this might be the parent who receives an alert when their child is actually at school. This might be the result of an error in the role marking process. If you receive an SMS in error please immediately phone the school office on 9499 1880.

We understand that this can be stressful for parents but *please* be patient with us whilst we are learning to manage the system. We are aiming for this not to happen often if at all. Thank you for your understanding.

Student supervision.

We have had a number of instances of late where the outcome could have been a trip to hospital rather than broken resources. Let's not be complacent regarding safety. If your child is participating in a private activity outside of school hours in the hall, music room or canteen foyer it is your responsibility to supervise your children. Please ensure that your child(ren) are respectful of property and look after the spaces and resources as you would expect them to at home.

Out of School Hours. Parents must supervise their children at all times.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress.

Reminder – Curriculum Day is this Monday MAY 7th.

Our next Curriculum Day on May 7th staff will focus on building knowledge and developing practical strategies regarding mental health issues in the school setting. Specifically, social/emotional learning, emotion coaching for school staff and self-regulation.

The 2018 Attitudes to School Survey.

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

The 2018 Attitudes to School Survey will be conducted online at IPS over the period Monday 14th April 2018 to Friday 1st June 2018. All students in Years 4 to Year 6 will have the opportunity to participate in the survey that allows them to give us some feedback about what they think about their school and their education.

SCHOOL COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY - 2ND MAY

Items Discussed

Moved that all School Councillors will complete Governance Training as a part of the induction process.

Acknowledged the State Government Budget Grant of 4.5 million dollars for infrastructure development at the school. (2018/19 – 2020/21)

Endorsed the allocation of up to \$100,00 (of existing school funds) for the refurbishment of:

- Heating and cooling in the upstairs classrooms in the main building
- Removal of the old Rinnai heaters in those classrooms
- Steam cleaning of all classroom carpets
- Re-carpeting of the school entrance and office foyer and administration areas
- Re-carpeting of the upstairs hallway.
- Purchase of Collaborative furniture for the library/collaborative space.

Congratulated the Out of School Hour Care Team on their accolade of being recognised as a unique 120 place service at Victoria's OSHC Conference. Members of the conference group will visit the OSHC program.

Acknowledged the employment of Two Educational Support/ Integration Aides and the interview of candidates for the Canteen assistant position.

Moved the Balance Sheet, Sub Program Budget and Operating Statement for the Period as at 31 March 2018

Discussed communication and the education of the IPS community around the poor uptake of the Voluntary Digital Learning Contribution. The engagement and communication focus group reviewing all communication avenues.

Acknowledged the Education Committee is continuing to update the enrolment policy.

Discussed the Facilities Committee ideas on creating new playground activities in collaboration with the students. Thanked the Grade 6 parents and others who attended the recent working bee.
