Want to help your child at home? This week we're exploring Italian.

At Ivanhoe Primary School, all students participate in and enjoy one Italian session each week. Students learn about Italy's culture and its historical beauty, visiting well known icons via Google Earth. All students are currently revising and extending their vocabulary to converse with peers. We have made puppets to assist us in our use of everyday Italian and have been writing and reading conversations with classmates in small groups.

At home, you can ask your child to teach you some of these everyday, well-rehearsed words and phrases and have a go at greeting each other in Italian.

Fun apps to record and listen back to these conversations are; Yakit and Puppetpals. Languagesonline published in Victoria can add a challenge through fun tasks and games. Fantastico!
