Want to help your child at home? Let's talk about the weather. Watching the weather.

Because it changes daily, the weather can be a great topic to discuss maths with your child.

Try these activities:

- Visit the website <http://www.bom.gov.au/vic/>
- Ask your child the difference between each day's minimum and maximum temperatures. Do they notice a pattern or trend in the weather changes?
- Find a seven-day forecast, then record the actual temperature for each day and compare. Ask your child if the forecast was accurate. Ask them what similarities and differences they notice.
- Use the information on the weather website to explore differences in weather between your area and other areas.
- Ask your child how much rain you get compared to other areas. Ask your child to identify differences in temperature between your area and other areas. Who might be affected by an increase or decrease in rainfall?
