


Temporary Fencing

Parent Opinion Survey

Each year IPS (and all government schools) conducts the Parent Opinion Survey of 15 per cent of the school community. In 2017, 200 of our families were randomly selected to participate. The survey closes this Sunday the 3rd. Information from the survey will guide some of our future planning and will be shared at School Council later in Term 4.

Curiosity and Powerful learning

Our work in this area is producing results in every class and learning space with

learning intentions clearly visible and students developing a clearer understanding of what success looks like. The Student Attitudes to School Survey has enabled us to develop a series of questions we plan to use with focus groups at Years Foundation through Year 3. We plan to look specifically at engagement, student voice and agency as a means to evaluate our wellbeing programs and transition practices.

In the spirit of network sharing IPS is hosting Fairfield Primary School for ½ a day next Tuesday as they focus their efforts on the Curiosity and Powerful learning journey.

Communication

Some of School Council's work has been to explore the communication practices between the school and the community. One of our School Councillors and parent has been leading focus groups with community members to identify practices that enable and facilitate effective communication. A small group will be meeting tonight to see where and how we can improve this important function across the school.



Division: (Boys and Girls in separate Division): Those born in 2011, 2010, 2009, 2008, 2007, 2006, 2005, 2004, 2003, 2002, 2001 and 2000.

Eligibility: This individual competition is open to players who:

- are born in the years mentioned above, and
- have scored at least 4.5 points (top 30%) in any Chess Victoria Zonal Interschool Chess Championship 2017 or have an ACF (Australian Chess Federation) classical or rapid rating in the ACF 2017 December rating list.
- Players are only allowed to win the trophy in the Division of the year which he/she was born.

Time Control: Each player has 12 minutes plus 3 seconds per move per game.

Date: TBA (will be on a Sunday in March 2018).

Time: 12:00pm registration for 12:30pm start. Prize giving at about 5:00pm.

Venue: Glen Waverley Secondary College, O'Sullivan Road, Glen Waverley.

Competition Format: (Organised by Chess Victoria)

- The Individual Swiss system will be used for the competitions.
- Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 individual players in each division.

Competition fee: **\$20** per player.

Closing date: One week before event or when the field becomes full.
