Foundation Innovation Morning Summary:

During Innovation Morning, Foundation students will be participating in a range of activities that incorporate some fundamental principles of Coding. You may observe students ordering events, giving and following directions, using repetition. Pop in to see how these skills are applied across the curriculum, with or without the use of a digital device.

Grade 1 & 2 Innovation Morning Summary

Years 1 and 2 students will be doing a carousel of tasks that use skills taught as part of the Digital Technologies Curriculum. There will be 'plugged' and 'unplugged' activities that students will try their hands at. Come in and see what we are getting up to!



Grade 3 & 4 Innovation Morning Summary

Within our classrooms you will be able to see a range of digital learning technologies (DLT) being used. Every day, students use their class OneNote to communicate, collaborate and create! This Wednesday we will be showing you how we use DLT to benefit our learning. In writing we have been collaboratively creating narratives using the Code.org Coding Course.

We are linking our knowledge of the narrative writing process, use of dialogue and our developing coding skills to create our own animated stories. In our mathematics session we will be learning about technology without the technology... Wondering how we do that? Come in and see!

Grade 5 Innovation Morning Summary

Reading & Viewing Rotations: Comprehension tasks

- Activities include - guided reading groups and independent comprehension tasks – with and without the use of Digital Technologies.

Code.org Course: Coding Tasks > Unplugged and Plugged Activities

- Throughout Course 3 on Code.org, students have been collaborating and applying different thinking skills in order to create flexible solutions to more complex problems.
- Students have been learning about the fundamentals of Computer Science with drag and drop block based coding. They have created their own drawings and games.



Grade 6 Innovation Morning Summary

What you will see happening in Grade 6 this Innovation morning?

6V will be using the Robotics in Collaboration Space at 9:00am – 9:50am

Students will be coding using

- * Dash Robots
- * Dot Robots
- * Sphero Robots
- * iPads
- * Green Screens

6SR (Art from 9-10:40am), 6V & 6HP will be continuing on with the Code.org Coding Course. This course includes a range of plugged and unplugged activities

- Students will be collaborating, creating and applying different thinking skills and strategies in order to solve coding based problems.
- Students will continue to build on their learning around the fundamentals of Computer Science with drag and drop block based coding. They will be able to show some of their creations within their 'Project Gallery' and demonstrate their progress within the 20-lesson course.

Art Room:

Grade 6SR (9 – 10:40am) will be creating a Mural on the Interactive Whiteboard.

Italian Room:

Grade 1/2O (9 – 9:50am) & Grade 2G (9:50 – 10:40am) will be using the iPad application, Video Scribe and Chatter Kid to describe themselves.

Grade 5S (10:40 – 11:30am) will be creating a Kahoot Jumble Quiz.

Physical Education (Hall):

Grade 3's (9 – 11:30am) will be using video clips to review techniques of throwing and catching.

Music Room:

Grade 2L (9-9:50am), Grade 1/2O (9:50-10:40am) & Grade 1M (10:40-11:30am) will be using the iPads to explore - Garage Band to create 'Live Loops', Scratch Jnr and Sketch a Song – in a rotation based group setting.

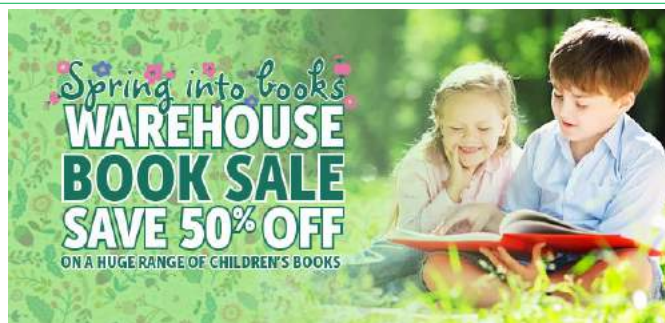

SCHOOL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT September 6th

- Current School enrolment is 616
- Foundation Student enrolment numbers for 2018 are similar to this time last year, 4 foundation classes in 2017.
- Retirement – School Council acknowledges the retirement of Anne Dakin after 23 years of dedicated service in the school's administration office. Anne will be sadly missed by students, teacher, parents and staff. A morning tea will be held Thursday September 21st for Anne. We congratulate Anne on her retirement and wish her all the best.
- Margret Tanner will also be retiring from the Business Office at the end of the school year after 9 years of service
- Recent Term 3 events; Thank you to staff, students and families who made Athletics Day, Trivia Night, Father's day and the toilet renovation a success.
- 2017 Naplan – Ivanhoe Primary School results were above National Minimum Standards. Results met and exceeded our 12-month AIP targets in all areas except writing, at year 5 level. Strategies are being put into place.
- Student year 4-6 survey results discussed, positive outcomes, with a reflection on student wellbeing.
- Bullying and Canteen Policies were updated and endorsed by school council.
- Canteen survey results were discussed, positive outcomes with a look at canteen pricing required.
- Operating Statement and Balance Sheet Detailed.
- Significantly below expectation Digital Learning Co contribution discussed. The school has only received a 1/3 of possible funding. School Council reflected on how the lack of co contribution will affect Digital Learning Outcomes for student and the ability to supply resources for Digital Learning.
- Innovation Day will be held on Wednesday 13th of September to celebrate Digital Learning at Ivanhoe Primary and display Class room digital learning. The EFTPOS machine will be available for families who have not co-contributed for 2017.
- A Digital Learning Partnership Grant has been applied for to support students and teachers in embracing the digital age and implementing the Australian Curriculum,
- Sensory Playground build commencing this week.
- New rubber surfacing to be placed under the year 2/OSHC playground.
- New bike racks being purchased for OSHC
- Toilet Refurbishment almost complete, thank you to Glenn Anderson for project managing and to the parents who contributed.
- Fair Planning continues with the supporter donations down on previous fair.

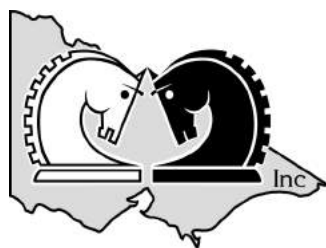
- We cater for all levels and goals—we offer Junior, Intermediate, Senior, and Fit Squads

Division: (Boys and Girls in separate Division): Those born in 2011, 2010, 2009, 2008, 2007, 2006, 2005, 2004, 2003, 2002, 2001 and 2000.

Eligibility: This individual competition is open to players who:

- are born in the years mentioned above, and
- have scored at least 4.5 points (top 30%) in any Chess Victoria Zonal Interschool Chess Championship 2017 or have an ACF (Australian Chess Federation) classical or rapid rating in the ACF 2017 December rating list.
- Players are only allowed to win the trophy in the Division of the year which he/she was born.

Time Control: Each player has 12 minutes plus 3 seconds per move per game.

Date: TBA (will be on a Sunday in March 2018).

Time: 12:00pm registration for 12:30pm start. Prize giving at about 5:00pm.

Venue: Glen Waverley Secondary College, O'Sullivan Road, Glen Waverley.

Competition Format: (Organised by Chess Victoria)

- The Individual Swiss system will be used for the competitions.
- Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 individual players in each division.

Competition fee: **\$20** per player.
